



Code of Conduct

TLCCWA Code of Conduct

1. Safety First:

- Always prioritise safety. Follow all safety guidelines and laws.
- Ensure all participants have the proper safety gear and equipment.

2. Respect for the Environment:

- Stay on designated trails and respect posted signs and closures.
- Leave no trace. Take out all rubbish and dispose of it properly.
- Avoid disturbing wildlife and their habitats.
- Minimize the impact on vegetation and terrain. Do not create new tracks.

3. Vehicle Maintenance:

- Maintain your 4WD vehicle in good working condition to minimise breakdowns on the trail.
- Regularly inspect and service your vehicle.

4. Responsible Driving:

- Observe all traffic laws and road rules.
- Drive at a safe and appropriate speed for the terrain.
- Give way to hikers, bikers, and equestrians.
- Be aware of other track users and pass them with caution.

5. No Trespassing:

- Respect private property and obtain necessary permissions before driving on private land.

6. Leave No Trace:

- Dispose of waste properly and use designated ablution facilities.
- Avoid creating new tracks or shortcuts.

7. Group Responsibility:

- Look out for your fellow club members and ensure everyone's safety.
- Be prepared for emergencies and have proper communication equipment.

8. Noise Control:

- Minimize noise pollution. Keep music down. Only use generators during the designated times.

9. Fire Safety:

- Obey fire bans and restrictions. Be cautious with open flames and cigarettes.

10. Education and Training:

- Encourage and participate in off-road driving and environmental education.
- Share knowledge and skills with others to promote responsible off-roading.

11. Respect for Others:

- Be courteous and respectful to other off-road enthusiasts and the public.
- Resolve conflicts peacefully and maintain a positive image for the club.

12. Reporting Violations:

- Report any violations of these rules to club leaders or relevant authorities.

13. Social Responsibility:

- Contribute to the local community through volunteer work, cleanup events, or charity initiatives.

14. Leadership by Example:

- As a club, set an example for responsible and ethical off-road driving.

15. Club Reputation:

- Understand that your actions on and off the trail reflect on the club. Uphold a positive image.

16. Legal Compliance:

- Abide by all federal, state, and local laws and regulations regarding off-road driving.
